Fridge problems – cooling - I currently know of two Suffolk Centre members who have had fridge problems when operating on the gas option inasmuch that the fridge refuses to cool sufficiently and the freezer compartment temperature is too warm to maintain food fully frozen. Investigation has in both cases revealed that the gas flame is correct i.e. colour and size etc but the cooling effect is lost. In both cases removing the whole fridge unit and turning it upside down has cured the fault. Returning it to its normal position and repeating the exercise. The only explanation the owners and myself can deduce is that an air lock must have occurred in the refrigerant that operating on gas (or electric) will not shift. The action of turning the fridge upside down being sufficient to clear such a problem.
