UNSURE ABOUT RALLYING? NEVER BEEN? WHAT TO EXPECT?



Lots of myths and legends surround the rallying part of caravanning whatever organisation you have joined. “Too organised” is just one that is often banded about. So, what is “organised”? Well, yes, as part of the Caravan and Motorhome Club, you will find the marshals will organise the pitches on the field according to Club rules for spacing. This is for your personal enjoyment and safety and to allow any emergency vehicles access or a speedy departure home for a member should they need to leave early. No-one wants to be pitched up too close to their neighbour, even the best of friends.

Every rally has its own theme, run by volunteer members, and fully advertised in the handbook, but there is no requirement for you to join in anything if you don't want to. Be aware though that a rally with a social may incur a charge whether you attend it or not - no marshal minds being asked before you book. Sometimes the marshals will advertise the price - this can't be done on all rallies though because costings depend on attendance. If you're unsure you can always ring first to see if an approximate price is available.

Services available on a rally, such as electric hook-up, are clearly advertised when, and if, available but there will always be fresh drinking water, waste water and toilet waste disposal at all venues. Marshals will also advertise if the venue will be sloping where those all-important levelling blocks will be needed.

Not sure, but perhaps interested? Then have another look through and if there's a rally on near you then why not give the marshal a call and arrange to call in and have a look around before venturing out with either your caravan or motorhome? We've all been a first rallier at some point, we're a friendly bunch, and would be very pleased to see you.

Go on give it a try - you've nothing to lose.

EHU / SPLITTERS

At our AGM in October 2018 mention was made of the use of splitters where EHU is available on rallies. After further discussion and with the advice from our Anglia Region this is to make members aware that connecting cables and splitters are not to be used on the rally field. The following has come from Club office.

“The Clubs stance regarding the compliance with the ‘Electrical Wiring Regulations’ and the updated requirements is that a cable supplying a caravan must be of one single length, without any connections (including splitters). These rules are the current wiring regulations and information is also stated in the Sites Directory, that no cable connections joining two or more cables together are permitted. Guests are welcome to have an electric cable plugged in from their outfit into their awning, like many do for heaters etc.”

This applies to both members and marshals as sometimes sites allow marshals access to an electric point, which is useful for such things as the electric tea urns, for their rallies.

With insurance in doubt should any incidents occur, we would ask that you follow this request.

WHAT IS A FELLOWSHIP PLAQUE AND HOW DO YOU GET ONE?

A Fellowship Plaque is very similar to the rally plaque you receive on attending a rally, but is something introduced some years ago, by Committee, to recognise those members attending 12 or more rallies in any one year from AGM to AGM. Whilst we do keep a record, from the attendance lists, you can complete the form in the book, indicating the rallies attended and your claim. These are awarded at the Natter and Chatter meeting - usually held in February over the weekend of the Valentine Rally.

WHAT IS THE DON ALCOCK TROPHY?

Within the Centre a member may stand for the post of Chairman or Chairlady for a maximum of 3 years - there are no such restrictions on any other Officer or Committee member. Don Alcock was Chairman for two years covering 1991 to 1993 and on his departure, gave this trophy to the Centre to be awarded to the member doing the most rallies in the year. Whilst Committee members can claim a Fellowship Plaque, they do not qualify for this award.

This has been presented every year since and those recipients are listed below. As you will see some have won it several times, and sadly some of our most active members are no longer rallying or no longer with us. Early achievements were in the 30+ rallies in a year, by 2019 this is in the 20's.

The Committee thanks all those members, whether they join us for one rally a year or on a regular basis, for their ongoing support of the Suffolk Centre.

CENTRE PRIVACY POLICY:

PRIVACY POLICY: Following on from our Privacy Policy in the 2019 handbook, the Club has issued a Privacy Policy for all Centres, in conjunction with their legal advisors, which members may get details of via: <https://www.caravanclub.co.uk/privacy-policy/centres-privacy-notice/>. WHEN DEPOSITS OR FULL PAYMENT IS ASKED FOR

Following advice from Club offices we wish to make it clear on refunds when a rally asks for deposits/full payments.

1. Rallies run abroad will have their own set of instructions and terms and conditions.
2. Rallies run alongside another organisation that you are booking with. It should be that that organisation will have their own Terms and Conditions which should be given on booking and will apply to any refunds. Application should be made to them, not via Suffolk marshals or committee.
3. For a Centre rally you should be advised by marshals:
 - a. If rally deposits are refundable or non-refundable at the time of booking.
 - b. If deposits are refundable it should state under what circumstances/timescale.
 - c. If deposits are non-refundable members can always apply to Committee, via the Centre Secretary, if they feel their personal circumstances warrant this to be set aside and a refund made.

If the Centre has to cancel a rally then all deposits are refundable. The above also covers where full payment is being asked for, or has been made.

ADMINISTRATION FEE

After a lot of deliberation, the Committee had to come to the decision to raise the Admin Fee from 2020. Part of the fee has always paid for your rally plaque, and will continue to do so, but from January 2020 the fee will rise from £1+VAT per unit per rally to £2+VAT per unit per rally. This is the first price increase for 9 years.

PAYMENT FOR RALLY FEES

Committee have taken the decision to mark all rallies as payment by **CASH ONLY** please. Cheque payments are minimal in these times but without guarantee cards, and with marshals paying their site owners in cash at the end of the rally, we hope you can appreciate why we have taken this decision. Cash payments was in your 2019 handbook.



THANKS FOR CHOOSING SUFFOLK CENTRE

Everyone knows what happens on a rally or do they? If you have not rallied before here is some information for a great weekend or holiday.

A rally is a get together of Caravan and Motorhome Club members who meet over a weekend or holiday to promote friendship and pursue many pleasures, pastimes and sports in a light-hearted manner with plenty of fun along the way. You should never feel obliged to join in anything which does not interest you - just relax and do as you please. The Rally Marshals are members like yourself, who have volunteered to organise and run the rally. This usually includes arranging the rally, signing the approach to the rally field and sometimes organising competitions and entertainment for all ages. Water supply and facilities for the disposal of waste water and toilet emptying will always be provided. Where a rally has EHU this will be clearly stated, it isn't available on all rallies.

The starting times of rallies are listed in the handbook rally details. The time stated allows the Marshals sufficient time to prepare, so please do not arrive before this time. On arrival, follow the signs to the marshals' van, where you will get all the information you need. They will hand you your envelope containing the rally programme and request payment, in cash unless the rally is prepaid.

The Rally Marshals will show you to your pitch on the rally field, ensuring adequate spacing between units. During the rally, there is a flagpole meeting. This is where ralliers gather together and the Rally Chairperson can welcome members, give out notices and thank the marshals. All you need in addition to items you would normally take to a commercial site is your own toilet and containers for fresh and waste water.

Why not give it a try? We have some great locations in out of the way places in parts of the Suffolk countryside. We sometimes venture further afield in the UK and abroad! If you would like to come along to a rally, call any of the Committee or marshals in the book. We all enjoy rallying and the pleasure it gives us and would like to share our pastime with you.

The Committee

If you have visitors to the rally, expected or otherwise, please ask them to report to the Rally Marshals so we know who is on site in case of any emergencies. If there is a social event planned be aware that the marshals would have only allowed for, and catered for, those booked on the rally. Thank you.

Please remember your rally marshals are all volunteers and respect any directions you are given by them. Some of the "rules and regulations" are there for your safety.

If members have any issues on a rally, there will be either be the Centre Chairman or a Committee Representative (Rally Chairman) there to help support marshals in dealing with problems.

If any member feels any issue should go further, this must be put in writing, to the Centre Secretary, where it will be brought before committee.

SUFFOLK CENTRE - CENTRE RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

THE CARAVAN AND MOTORHOME CLUB CENTRE RULES FOR SUFFOLK CENTRE

1. All rallies will be run in accordance with Club rules as laid down in the Sites Directory unless otherwise subject to Centre rules
2. Payment of all donations or site fees may be made by Centre cheque or Cash although it is advisable to contact the venue to confirm cheques are accepted. A receipt, and when applicable, a VAT receipt, must be obtained for all payments.
3. Proof of membership must be carried when attending a rally.
4. At the discretion of the Committee, any member having booked to attend a rally and cancelling within 14 days of the rally, or failing to attend, will be required to pay a fixed non-attendance fee of £10.
5. At the discretion of the Rally Marshal, and subject to The Caravan and Motorhome Club Rules governing tents, a small 2-man pup tent may be sited in the area usually occupied by the awning. Should a porch awning be erected a tent may be placed in the vacant area. The tent should not extend beyond the length of the caravan hitch or motorhome, or the depth of the awning.
6. A member may, at the discretion of the rally marshal, reserve adjacent pitches.
7. A vehicle may only be driven on the rally field by a holder of a full driving licence and valid insurance which entitles them to drive that class of vehicle.
8. Dogs must be kept on a lead of no more than 3 metres in length and exercised away from the vicinity of the units. When tethered they must be confined to a radius of three metres from the unit.
9. All vehicles are restricted to a speed of walking pace on rally sites.
10. Ball games and kite flying are not permitted in the vicinity of vehicles and units. Drones must not be flown on the rally field or within 50 metres of a person, vehicle or building not under your control.
11. Cycles may be ridden on the roadways of the rally field AT THE MARSHALS DISCRETION, BUT NOT BETWEEN THE VEHICLES AND UNITS.
12. Portable generators for personal use are permitted at the discretion of the rally marshal. Owners must be in attendance whilst their generator is in use and they should not normally be used before 9 a.m. nor after 4 p.m. on any day. In emergencies outside these times, it is at rally marshal's discretion.
13. Members attending Suffolk Centre Rallies are recommended to have a fire bucket by the 'A' frame of their caravan or front axle of their unit.

RALLY SLIPS. Rally marshals endeavour to plan for your pleasure - please help them by **booking in good time.** It is helpful if you can estimate your time of arrival. If you book and find you are unable to attend, please notify the rally marshal as soon as possible. **See centre rule 4.** Late alterations to rally details can only be sent to those who have booked in time.

If you are likely to have friends or family visiting you over the rally and you would like them to stay for the social, **PLEASE** check with the marshals **BEFORE** the rally to avoid any embarrassment. Please note that some rallies have a restriction on numbers attending their socials due to hall fire regulations.

RALLY FEES. Rally and site fees have mostly been omitted from this programme. Your envelope given to you on arrival will detail the fees involved. Payment is then due by cash **ONLY** please. Extra charges, when known in advance, appear in the booklet.

DEPOSITS/FULL PAYMENT ON RALLIES. Some rallies may ask for a deposit or full payment by providing a booking form. Full conditions of any refunds due to members cancelling should be stated clearly on this form. Payments to outside organisations, alongside a rally, are expected to have their own terms and conditions. In the event a member feels a refund is warranted outside the rally terms and conditions, this must be put in writing to the Committee, via the Centre Secretary. A full outline of conditions can be found on Page 9 of this handbook.

SITES. S.C.C.C. rally direction signs will be posted where possible. Owing to vandalism and the possibility of signs being moved or misdirected, we ask members to take care in villages and populated areas and to follow the directions prepared by the rally marshal. When using a Sat Nav be aware the postcode may not be precise to the venue. For 2020 we will have details via www.what3words.com, printed for location of the site. This we understand is used by the emergency services as well. **All rallies commence at 4p.m. and close 4 p.m. Sunday unless otherwise stated. Members wishing to arrive before or leave after those times should consult the rally marshal before the rally.**

Please site your unit with the front offside corner over the peg unless otherwise directed by the rally marshal. Own sanitation is required at all rallies. Please observe the arrangements for waste/chemical toilet disposal and take dry rubbish home with you.

Remember at all times to observe the caravan and country codes which we all undertake to do when joining the club.

Centre rally site rules are invariably those applicable to club sites. Gazebos are only permitted to be erected and used by the rally marshals for the benefit of the rally. Please do not use alongside your unit.

OTHER EVENTS. Information about rallies or individual events organised by Suffolk or other Centres can be obtained by sending a stamped addressed envelope to the Rally Secretary concerned or via email: rallysec@suffolkcentre.co.uk.

FUTURE PROGRAMME. Centre officers and committee members invite members to discuss Centre and Club matters with them. Suggestions for future events, new rally sites and offers to act as host or marshal are particularly welcome.

POST CODES. Some rallies have the Post Code included within their details. Please make yourself familiar with these details, as they may be required in the case of an emergency. If you require details of Post Codes which are not printed, then please contact the rally marshals.

INSURANCE DISCLAIMER. All persons attending rallies and social functions do so entirely at their own risk. No responsibility for persons or property is accepted by the organisers (i.e. The Caravan Club) or their insurers.

COMPLAINTS

Should you have a complaint whilst on a rally, please approach the Rally Chairman in the first instance.

If, however, you are unhappy with the outcome or wish to complain about another matter not on the rally field, please write to the Centre Secretary.

Your letter will then be addressed by the Committee and a response will be provided.
