HELLO AND WELCOME TO SUFFOLK CENTRE AND OUR PROGRAMME FOR 2026

So, you have decided to join Suffolk Centre, excellent choice, and from everyone involved we say thank you and welcome. If you are new to all of this, just remember we have all been there before, and as they say you will not know if you like it until you try it. We are all here for the same reason – to enjoy our hobby with like-minded people, and while we use licenced sites, we also can be found at a village hall or out the back of a lovely country pub – places you would not normally go.

Do you have to join in with what is on? Well, no, but you will be made most welcome and the choice will be yours. Rallies with halls/entertainment will rely on members attending paying towards the costs, so it is better to ask if you can just pitch up and not be part of any social event.

You can expect as a minimum, access to drinking water, somewhere to empty dirty wastewater, and somewhere to empty the “loo”. You should find easy access to, and into the site, but we cannot totally promise level pitches, so levelling blocks or equipment would be advisable to have.

The rally details will give the how to get there, what to expect, who is organising it and other details. It will clearly state if electric hook-up is available or not (described by some as “off grid”). Please do not be too daunted by the thought of surviving on a battery – many units now come with solar power as standard, and it is easy enough to get quite a high powered “suitcase” style which will keep batteries ticking over nicely on most days. The only thing to remember is that your power sockets will not work, but there are ways round that. Many of us have survived the “off grid” for years.

Our marshals, and the committee, are all volunteers and members themselves who give their time to organise all our events and enable the Centre to operate.

When you arrive on the rally, the marshals will be there to help you, get you to normally a pitch of your choice, and they always welcome contact before the rally if you are unsure of anything. We have a few “rules”, agreed by members, for your safety and enjoyment. For example, we love seeing and meeting families on our rallies but kindly ask that Junior enjoys their bike ride or ball game away from the rally area and not between those units attending. One thing that is a no I am afraid, is kite flying anywhere near the rally field and no drones to be flown please.

So why not try it – or perhaps if we are local to you pop along to see us and get an idea of what to expect.

- If you have enjoyed a rally, consider giving **one weekend** next year to help the rally marshal.
- If you have great ideas for a new venue or event, please do not just tell me—tell us, and then help us make it happen.
- And if you can only come along, please come along with **enthusiasm**. Bring your neighbours, share your stories, and encourage the new members.



New format Rally Slips - Rally slips were redesigned for 2025 and have been further updated to show that by sending a rally slip you are making an actual booking. If you are interested in a rally but unable to confirm, please contact the marshals to let them know. They will be happy to make a note and stay connected with you. Slips are available in Word format so you can download, save, and either print or email to rally marshals. We recommend that you ask for a read receipt or acknowledgement so that then both sides have confirmation of the booking.

At the end of each rally details, we have added in a “My Notes” section. We also know members like to keep track of how many rallies they have been out with us on – so a handy spot for that as well.

If you're not sure how many rallies you have attended, just email: secretary@suffolkcentre.co.uk and a list can be sent to you to go through. If you find any omissions just let us know.

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For everyone's enjoyment and safety please read and be aware of a few rules we have in place

THE CARAVAN AND MOTORHOME CLUB CENTRE RULES FOR SUFFOLK CENTRE

- 1** - All rallies will be run in accordance with Club rules as laid down in the Sites Directory unless otherwise subject to Centre rules
- 2** - Payment of all donations or site fees may be made by Centre cheque or Cash although it is advisable to contact the venue to confirm cheques are accepted. A receipt, and when applicable, a VAT receipt, must be obtained for all payments.
- 3** - Proof of membership must be carried when attending a rally.
- 4** - At the discretion of the Committee, any member having booked to attend a rally and cancelling within 14 days of the rally, or failing to attend, are required to pay a fixed non-attendance fee of £10.
- 5** - At the discretion of the Rally Marshal, and subject to The Caravan and Motorhome Club Rules governing tents, a small 2-man pup tent may be sited in the area usually occupied by the awning. Should a porch awning be erected a tent may be placed in the vacant area. The tent should not extend beyond the length of the caravan hitch or motorhome, or the depth of the awning.
- 6** - A member may, at the discretion of the rally marshal, reserve adjacent pitches.
- 7** - A vehicle may only be driven on the rally field by a holder of a full driving licence and valid insurance which entitles them to drive that class of vehicle.
- 8** - Dogs must be kept under control and on a lead no more than two metres long, and if the dog is tethered it must be within the boundaries of your rally pitch. Animals must be exercised away from units and any fouling cleaned up promptly. If an animal is left in an outfit, it must have adequate ventilation and water because of the speed by which temperatures can rise in an outfit.
- 9** - All vehicles are restricted to a speed of walking pace on rally sites.
- 10** - Ball games and kite flying are not permitted in the vicinity of vehicles and units. Drones must not be flown on the rally field or within fifty metres of a person, vehicle or building not under your control.
- 11** - Cycles may be ridden on the roadways of the rally field AT THE MARSHALS DISCRETION, BUT NOT BETWEEN THE VEHICLES AND UNITS.
- 12** - Portable generators for personal use are permitted at the discretion of the rally marshal. Owners must be in attendance whilst their generator is in use, and they should not normally be used before 9 a.m. nor after 4 p.m. on any day. In emergencies outside these times, it is at rally marshal's discretion.
- 13** - Members attending Suffolk Centre Rallies are recommended to have a fire bucket by the 'A' frame of their caravan or front axle of their unit.

BRIEF HISTORY OF THE SUFFOLK CENTRE

From the mid-fifties to 1965 Caravan Rallies were organised by the Eastern Counties Centre, comprising of the counties of Norfolk, Suffolk, Cambridgeshire, Huntingdonshire and Peterborough. During 1967 many Suffolk members decided that Suffolk should become a Centre in its own right. A request was made to the Caravan Club Headquarters, and a meeting was called at Haughley Village Hall, chaired by the then Vice Chairman of the Caravan Club – Eric Barrett. After much discussion a vote was taken and 95% of Suffolk members opted for their own Centre. A committee was formed as follows: Chairman – Ken Bartholomew. Vice-Chairman – Ted Squire. Treasurer – Fred Palmer and Secretary – Iris Bull.

Committee members were: Ken Blake, John Bolton, Cecil Cleaver, Derek Adams, Dave Dickson, Phil Long and John Bull. John Bull took over the duties of Rally Secretary and prepared the first Rally Programme and to start the Centre each committee member loaned the Centre £5.00 to cover expenses. Equipment was obtained as follows:

Rally signs made by Ted Squires, Flagpole made and presented by John Bull, White First Aid box made by Phil Long along with the "Dog on Lead" sign, The Pennant was printed and purchased from a member in Clacton, later replaced by a new one made and presented by Iris Bull, The china "Suffolk Punch" horse was presented by Ted Squire and mounted/boxed by Phil Long, small pennants designed by Fred Palmer from the Lawn Mower logo, the Suffolk Punch tablecloth made and presented by Iris Bull and the "Pennants" tablecloth by Ivan Howlett.

Since then, many committees have been formed and led by those listed below. We also passed our 50th Anniversary in 2018.

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THE A – Z OF OTHER RELEVANT INFORMATION

CENTRE REGISTRATION

When you receive your annual membership renewal notification letter from the Caravan and Motorhome Club, don't forget to re-register with the Centre.

There are 3 methods available: 1) Complete the Centre Registration Card on the back of the lower part of the letter and send it ASAP to the Caravan and Motorhome Club, or 2) Telephone the Club on 01342 318813 or, 3) renew online at:

<http://www.caravanclub.co.uk/centremembership>. If you do not re-register you will not:

1. Receive any information we circulate
2. Be allowed to speak or vote at the AGM
3. Be eligible to propose or second any member for committee.
4. Most important, not receive next years handbook.

By the Club being in receipt of your instructions, they are able to report back to the Centre Secretary to update their information and keep you on the membership list.

COUNTRY CODE

Follow the Country Code and guard against all risk of fire.

Fasten all gates and always keep dogs under proper control.

Keep to the footpaths across farmland and avoid damaging fences, hedges and walls.

Leave no litter and safeguard all water supplies.

Protect wildlife, plants and trees and go carefully on country roads.

Respect the life of the countryside.

DOGS ON RALLIES

Members are asked to make sure they are aware of Centre rules when bringing their family pet with them. We welcome our furry friends on all rallies but for everyone's safety and comfort, we must ask that they are not let to run loose on the rally field. When outside units they should be tethered, lead no longer than two metres, not long enough to encroach on the next-door pitch, and they should be taken off the rally field for exercise and those personal moments!

EXPECTING VISITORS / POPPING OUT TO THE SHOPS?

How would you feel if, when returning from a shopping trip, someone had been in your caravan or motorhome? Increasingly visitors come onto a rally, do not stop; go straight to a caravan or motorhome for a visit. The marshals do not know who they are, or who they visit. So please if you have visitors coming get them to stop and introduce themselves before coming to your caravan or motorhome. It is only common courtesy after all, but it could save your property.

MEMBER RESPONSIBILITY

All persons attending rallies and social events do so entirely at their own risk. No responsibility for persons or property is accepted by the organisers of The Caravan and Motorhome Club

PAYMENTS AGAINST RALLIES

Following advice from Club offices we wish to make it clear on refunds when a rally asks for deposits/full payments.

1. Rallies run abroad will have their own set of instructions and terms and conditions.
2. Rallies run alongside another organisation that you are booking with. It should be that that organisation will have their own Terms and Conditions which should be given on booking and will apply to any refunds. Application should be made to them, not via Suffolk marshals or committee.
3. For a Centre rally you should be advised by marshals:
 - a. If rally deposits are refundable or non-refundable at the time of booking.
 - b. If deposits are refundable it should state under what circumstances/timescale.
 - c. If deposits are non-refundable members can always apply to Committee, via the Centre Secretary, if they feel their personal circumstances warrant this to be set aside and a refund made.

If the Centre has to cancel a rally, then all deposits are refundable. The above also covers where full payment is being asked for or has been made.

PHOTOGRAPHS/VIDEOS AND PUBLICITY

Please note that when passing a rally slip to book a place you will see a notice on the slip as follows: *By booking this rally I have read and accept the Privacy Policy and Rules of the Centre. Unless I otherwise notify you, I agree that any photographs taken on the rally, in which I am included, may be used for Centre publicity purposes. YES / NO.* Please make sure you indicate your preference. These photographs/videos may be used in publicity about the Centre.

RALLY SLIPS/RALLY FEES

RALLY SLIPS.

We have redesigned the rally slips – easy to complete and available as well by email – message rallysec@suffolkcentre.co.uk for copies – so you can pre-fill, save and send even by email to the Rally Marshals – where an email address has been given.

Rally marshals endeavour to plan for your pleasure – please help them by booking in good time. It is helpful if you can estimate your time of arrival. If you book and find you are unable to attend, please notify the rally marshal as soon as possible. **See centre rule 4.** Late alterations to rally details can only be sent to those who have booked in time.

If you are likely to have friends or family visiting you over the rally and you would like them to stay for any social, **PLEASE** check with the marshals **BEFORE** the rally to avoid any embarrassment. Please note that some rallies have a restriction on numbers attending their socials due to hall fire regulations.

RALLY FEES.

Rally and site fees have been placed in the programme where possible. Payment will depend on the rally but may be by cash on arrival, BACS payment or Sum-up. Collection will be down to each rally's requirements. An envelope given to you on arrival will detail the fees involved. Some marshals will email to let you know any essential information (road restrictions) along with the cost of the rally.

For rallies requiring a booking form/prepayment please read terms and conditions carefully before handing to the marshals.

REWARDS

WHAT IS A FELLOWSHIP PLAQUE AND HOW DO YOU GET ONE?

A Fellowship Plaque is similar to the rally plaque you receive on attending a rally but is something introduced some years ago by Committee. The number of rallies to qualify is decided each year and runs from January to December. We do keep a record of those attending from the attendance lists.

WHAT IS THE DON ALCOCK TROPHY?

Don Alcock was Chairman for two years covering 1991 to 1993 and on his departure, gave this trophy to the Centre to be awarded to the member doing the most rallies in the year. Whilst Committee members can claim a Fellowship Plaque, they do not qualify for this award. This has been presented every year since (except for 2020) and those recipients are listed below. As you will see some have won it several times, and sadly some of our most active members are no longer rallying or no longer with us. Early achievements were in the 30+ rallies in a year, by 2019 this is in the 20's. The Committee thanks all those members, whether they join us for one rally a year or on a regular basis, for their ongoing support of the Suffolk Centre.

VENUES WE USE

SITES. Blue and White S.C.C.C. rally direction signs will be posted where possible. Owing to vandalism and the possibility of signs being moved or misdirected, we ask members to take care in villages and populated areas and to follow the directions prepared by the rally marshal. When using a Sat Nav be aware the postcode may not be precise to the venue. Using Google maps or What3Words will enable a visual appreciation of the site entry. Please site your unit with the front offside corner over the peg/cone unless otherwise directed by the rally marshal. Own sanitation is required at all rallies. Please observe the arrangements for waste/chemical toilet disposal and take dry rubbish home with you. Centre rally site rules are invariably those applicable to club sites. Gazebos are only permitted to be erected and used by the rally marshals for the benefit of the rally. Please do not use alongside your unit.

All rallies commence at 4p.m. and close at 4 p.m. unless otherwise stated in the handbook. Members wishing to arrive before or leave after those published times should consult the rally marshal before the rally.
